Integrated Work Plan (IWP)

- The Integrated Work Plan (IWP) is a blue print for coordinating interventions and activities among appropriate State Implementing Agencies (SIAs) and grantee/contractor.
- It describes the target audience, as well as the goals, objectives, and specific activities the grantee/contractor will work towards over the grant/contract period. The IWP also provides the framework for interventions (e.g. Policy, System, and Environmental Change Goals) and evaluation.
- The IWP focuses on conducting interventions/activities that reach Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Education (SNAP-Ed) eligible Californians and further the CDPH's goals of improving the dietary habits of participants, as well as promoting physical activity, federal nutrition assistance programs, and obesity prevention.

3 year roadmap

- Demographics
- Race/ethnic composition;
- Primary language;
- Nutrition behaviors;
- Food Insecurity rates;
- Physical activity behaviors;
- Obesity prevalence;
- Geographic location, including underserved areas;
- Number and/or percentage of CalFresh participants;
- Summary of food and activity environments (i.e. access); and
- Other nutrition-related programs serving low-income persons.

Community Assessment and Community Change Goals

Describe and Identify:

- Describe assessments and/or data sources.
- What was learned?
- How was this data used to develop this three-year IWP?

Describe:

- Long-term community change goals.
- Align with the community assessment?
- Efforts on how identified unmet needs are being addressed.
- Objectives and strategies to be implemented.

Partnerships and Collaboration

Local Health Departments and Champion Provider Fellows –

- Communication between the LHD and Provider is vital.
- Overarching communication goal: Connection between the LHD Project Director, Champion Provider Fellow, and the Health Officer.
