- CommuniCare is a FQHC (Federal Qualified Health Center), we care for a low income and under-served population in the community.

Background

- ~65% of patients are 100% or below poverty limit.
- Patients have barriers to access to healthy food and transportation to grocery stores; many have limited knowledge of healthy diet impact on well being.
- Outreach activities expanding the understanding and practice of healthy living can benefit the community.

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- Cultural foods and traditions:
 Remembering and sharing recipes, foods, herbs, and health knowledge.
- Día de los Muertos/Day of the Dead: CommuniCare hosts a public event at the garden to celebrate and honor those who have passed. A community altar is a significant component of this celebration.

Centering Gardening

- Organic farming methods ensure health of growers, eaters, and the earth
- Crops are selected based on cultural relevance and specific health benefits they may deliver

Centering Cooking

- Cooking Matters Curriculum:
 Evidence-based materials help
 patients learn how to make healthy,
 easy, and affordable meals.
- Cooking Classes at the Garden:
 Educational topics include healthy eating, shopping, etc.; discussion-based and hands-on learning; grocery bags allow for recreating recipes at home.

Centering Sharing of Food

Food connects people to each other, to the earth, and to culture and traditions.

Applying what they learn in class at home and with others.

Remembering traditions and connecting with friends and family.

Improving individual and community health.



Centering Connection

- Patients, college students, and community members volunteer
- Staff-focused cooking events
- Outdoor classroom = baby shower destination!
- Frequently visited by participants in substance use disorder treatment groups







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DECOLONIZING MEDICINE 2022

Centering Self-Efficacy

- Grant-funded staff offer ~1 hour-long one-on-one self-management support
- Group Medical Visits convene patients, a primary care provider and a diabetes educator to learn, support each other and practice skills together
- Home visits ensure access to patients encountering transportation barriers
- Diabetes Health Educators are integrated with Mobile Medicine and offer education, Hemoglobin A1C tests and food at migrant housing centers, shelters, motels...

- Further integrating Healthy Living with Diabetes and Food is Medicine activities
- Complementing program delivery with process and outcomes evaluation
