

Webinar Q & A Follow-Up from CDPH Prevention Forward

Q1: Can Nurse Practitioners write referrals to DSME?

Answer: YES

In order to be referred to a DSMES program, the participant must have a diagnosis of diabetes and a **written referral** from the treating physician or qualified non-physician practitioner (such as a physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or advanced practice nurse). Q2: Are there age restrictions for NDPP self-referrals?

Answer: YES

According to <u>DPRP Standards and Operating Procedures (2018)</u>, the program participant must be age 18 or older.

Q3: Can we access any success stories about prevention and management strategies?

Answer: YES

CDPH Prevention Forward Team can share successful strategies from contractors and/or partners, who communicate with quarterly about collaboration and implementation of Prevention Forward strategies and activities.

Q4: Has the campaign been showcased in Merced County?

Answer: YES

A contracted advertising agency is currently developing the Campaign ads and the actual media campaign will likely be launched in June 2020.
