

# Complex issues are uniquely predisposed to collective impact



- Non-profit
   organizations dedicated
   to bettering the quality
   of life in the community
- Many provide services and support to those that are most vulnerable or marginalized
- Many might already be engaged in care delivery addressing patient social needs

## Partnering with CBOs: Challenges

- Organizational capacity
- Priority alignment
- Understanding/adapting to a new organizational culture
- Time investment

## There is value in partnership

- Resources/resource sharing
- Problem identification & insight
- Data
- Communications
- Partners
- Advocacy
- Amplification of efforts
- Credibility





## Partnership Building Considerations

- Understand the CBO landscape
- Understand past partnership history
- Utilize an asset based approach
- Establish mutual understanding, respect, trust and bidirectional communication early on
- Develop aligned vision, goals and metrics for success
- Create a process for decision-making
- Expectation setting know what you can and cannot offer
