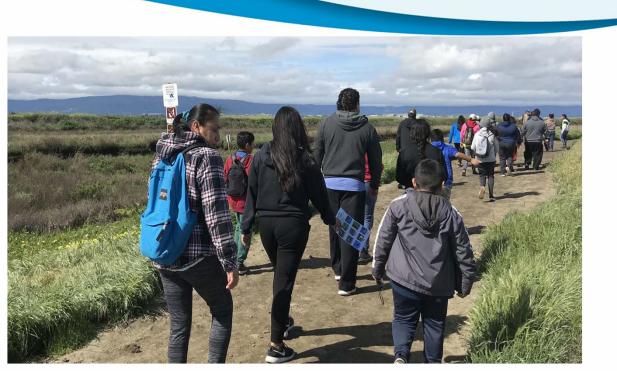

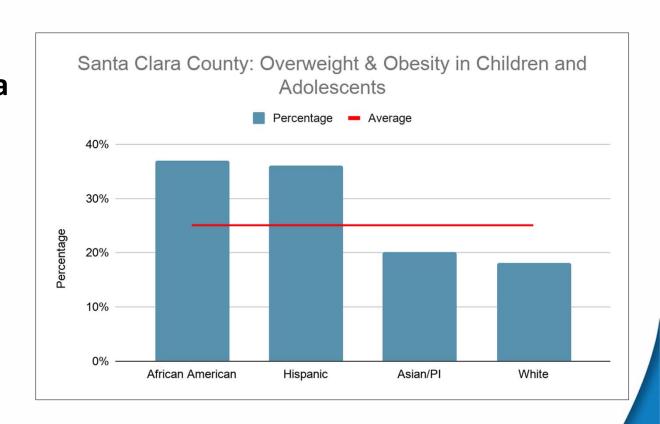

## Background

- Access to nature in safe parks & green spaces is a social determinant of health which leads to health inequities for children of color
- Inadequate physical activity contributes to increased risk of obesity and overweight

# PSE Intervention: Structured Physical Activity (Park Rx)

- Park Prescription movement
  - Health Parks, HealthyPeople (HPHP)
- Collaboration between
  - Healthcare providers
  - Park agencies
  - Community organizations

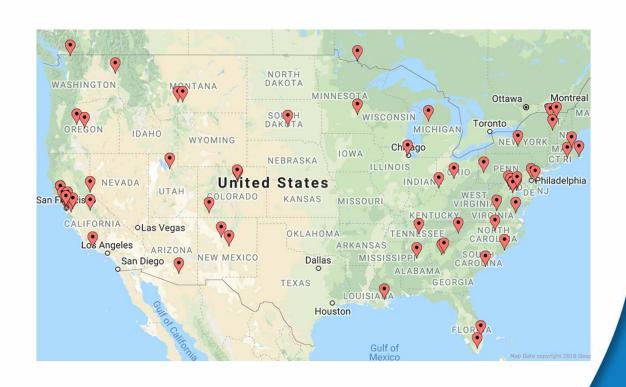

## Santa Clara County Park Rx Collaborative

- Tripartite collaboration between Public Health, County Parks and Valley Medical Center clinics
- Designed to overcome barriers to park access:
  - Coordinated transportation
  - Bilingual services
  - Frequent organized walks & activities
  - Clinician attendance
  - Staff consistency
  - Creating a welcoming environment











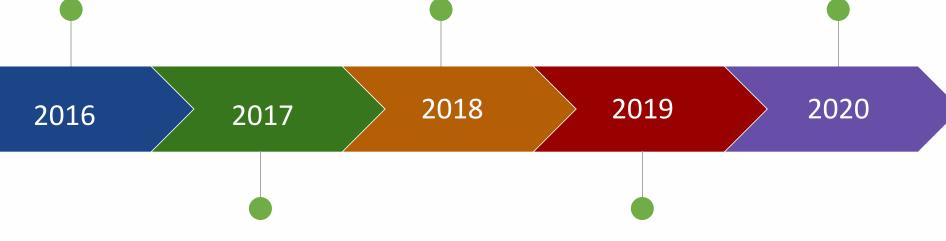


### **Timeline**

Open Space Authority Grant Increased Outing Frequency:

- Twice a month
- Quarterly

- Primary Care Clinic Site
  Outings
- Open Space Authority Grant for program expansion



**Park Outings Begin** 

- Stanford Evaluation
- Outdoor Children's Bill of Rights Grant
- Transportation Grant

# **Stanford Program Evaluation**

"You distract yourself, you're not as stressed anymore or anything like that, because it's beautiful to meet more people and we learn from everyone."

- Focus groups & follow-up calls:
  - Caregivers
  - Children
- Consistently showed themes of
  - Unique nature experiences
  - Stress reduction
  - Increased social connectedness
    - Increased time for family
    - Chance to meet new people

"I feel more motivated because you see a lot of people participating."











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"It's like therapy, going outside."

"We learn from new people and you get to know new people and experience something new and beautiful."

# **Opportunities & Challenges Since COVID-19**



#### **CHALLENGES**

- Park closures
- Staff not available
- Fear of COVID exposure
- COVID fatigue





#### **OPPORTUNITIES**

- Connecting with families virtually
- Trauma-informed Gardening & Cooking classes
- Collaboration with other Bay Area Park Rx programs

### **Next Steps**

- Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights
  - Community input
  - Lever to implement policy & system level changes
  - Address social inequities to increase access to green spaces
- JUNTOS Program Expansion
  - Increased access & programing
  - EMR Integration of nature screening
  - Connect families to community partners
  - Peer-to-Peer programs
